SASCV – Dr. Dipak Halder Outstanding Young Scholar Award



The *Dr. Dipak Halder Outstanding Young Scholar Award* recognizes a student who demonstrates outstanding potential as a researcher in the field of Criminology/Criminal Justice and Victimology. While prior research accomplishments are important, the Awards Committee will especially consider the quality of his/her paper submission. The Award will be given to the student during the Valedictory Session of the Third International Conference of the South Asian Society of Criminology and Victimology (SASCV), to be held during 28-29, January, 2016 at Goa, India. The award consists of a Plaque, a Certificate and Rupees Five Thousand Cash Prize.

Rules and Regulations:

1. It will be given to a student under the age of 35 (Only full time UG/PG/M.Phil/PhD Students only are eligible. Part-timers/distance education/Evening College students are not eligible).
2. Selections for this award will be on the basis of quality of the abstracts submitted by the student and his/her previous outstanding contribution to the field.
3. All papers submitted by a student on the themes of the conference, empirical/theoretical/conceptual/critical reviews will be considered. Only single authored abstracts will be considered for the award.
4. Weightage will be given to 20% Curriculum Vitae, 30% abstract submission, and 50% extended abstract submission.
5. The Awards Committee will only consider the quality of the content of the abstracts/paper and the student's previous contribution to the field. The Awards committee will not examine the Presentation skills.
6. It is open to all nationalities (an International Award).

About Dr. Dipak Halder

Dr. Dipak Halder, an Indian Police Service (IPS) Officer of West Bengal Cadre, India was the first police officer in India to have an academic detour to the field of Criminology / Criminal Justice. In the late 60's, he did his MS in Criminal Justice from Michigan State University, USA and later he received a Ph.D. Degree from the University of Calcutta, in the field of Industrial Security. He is a pioneer in developing Indian Criminology and always inspired students who attended the conferences of the Indian Society of Criminology (ISC). Dr. Dipak Halder expired on 7th April, 2008 in Kolkata, India.
